Everything is packed except for those last few items that you don't know what to do with. Putting these electronics and appliances in a box with no protection is not an option. So what do you do? We know the best way to move these items and we have some suggestions to help you get these items moved safely.

#### **Electronics**

- If you have the original box and packing materials, this is always the best way to pack and transport your electronic pieces.
- If you don't have original packing, wrap in a blanket and be sure to pad generously.
- Remove all CDs & DVDs from equipment prior to moving.
- Wiring must be disconnected before moving. A good hint to reassemble once you're moved is to wrap tape on each end of the wire and specify where it needs to be plugged in at or draw a diagram prior to disassemble.
- Label and pack your remote controls in one place.
- When moving printers, remember to remove the ink cartridges and put in a plastic bag.

#### **Appliances**

- Secure all loose parts in refrigerator. Don't forget to defrost 2 to 3 days prior to moving day.
- Dry the unit to prevent mold.
- Fill washer and dryer with clothes or soft toys to prevent the drum from moving around
